AT THE FEBRUARY BCA MEETING...

- County staff members Richard Best and Jill Yutan presented a draft landscaping plan that will accompany the improvements being made along Wilson Boulevard between George Mason Drive and North Frederick Street. Funded through the County's Arterial Transportation Management (ATM) program, these improvements include the new traffic lights and pedestrian crossings at the Wilson-George Mason intersection.
- The draft landscaping plan showed a variety of maples and other shade trees that are to be planted in new raised medians as well as along the sidewalk on either side of Wilson Boulevard. The membership voted to approve the draft landscaping plan, and County staff will present a final landscaping plan to the membership later this spring. According to recent estimates, the landscaping work should be completed sometime this summer.

AT THE NEXT MEETING (APRIL 26)...

- Speaker to be announced.
- Update on the AM radio tower intended to advise the public during emergencies and natural disasters. Originally intended for location behind the fire station, Virginia Power (owner of the easement) will not allow the antenna in that specific spot. Alternate location and plans to be discussed.
- Report on Silverwood Associates plans for the Washingotn Motors site on Glebe Road.
- And as always, the floor will then be open to concerns, input and requests from you the residents of our neighborhood. The Board of BCA is here to listen and serve you.


