The NC Plan update committee will use residents' input from the February design forum and the enclosed NC survey to substantively update Bluemont's NC Plan. Once the membership votes to approve the updated plan, BCA will forward it to the county for final approval.

Next General Meeting Wed., April 21, 7:30 pm at ATS We have invited Va. Tech urban design grad student Jane Kim to present the results of February's design forum, which she led as part of her graduate project. (See the related article on p.2.)

Kim will unveil her recommendations for a unified design framework-known as the Bluemont Village Center concept—to guide future redevelopment along the Wilson Boulevard commercial corridor between N. George Mason Drive and N. Greenbrier Street. Kim's work along with the results of the survey included with this newsletter will be used to update the Bluemont Neighborhood conservation (NC) Plan (last published in 1999). On 3/24, the membership hosted a discussion of the proposed referendum to change Arlington's form of government. We thank Arlington Coalition of Police President Ken Dennis and former County Board member Roye Lowry for providing a spirited debate of the issue. Members also voted to approve budgets for BCA's 5/15 barbecue and for the implementation of an electronic version of the NC Plan survey ((\$100 each). Virginia Tech graduate student Jane S. Recent BCA Accomplishments

•N. Frederick Street curb, gutter, and sidewalk. Originally scheduled to be considered at the March 14 County Board meeting, the NC project for N. Frederick Street was pulled from the agenda. On March 16, activist Jim Hurysz spoke out against the Frederick Street project and the six other NC projects being considered. Luckily BCA member Bob Atkins was on hand, and he spoke in favor of the Frederick Street project and the other NC projects on the docket. Ultimately, the Arlington County Board voted unanimously to approve funding for all seven NC projects. Bond funds approved by voters in 2008 will be used to construct a sidewalk, curb, and gutter for N. Frederick Street between I-66 and Wilson Boulevard. Our thanks go to hard-working NC representative Carl Drummond who has been shepherding this project through the long funding-to-construction process.

•Harrison Street Bike Trail Spur. Late last year, the county finally completed the link between N. Harrison Street (next to the I-66 overpass) and the Custis Trail. Now hikers and bikers can easily access the trail from Harrison Street. Our thanks go to BCA member Chris Healey who wrote and submitted a park enhancement grant (PEG) that helped to fund this project.



Thanks to the diligence of **Chris Healey** and other Bluemont residents — and backed by the BCA this connector to the Custis Trail was cleared and paved this past year.

Walk for the Animals


